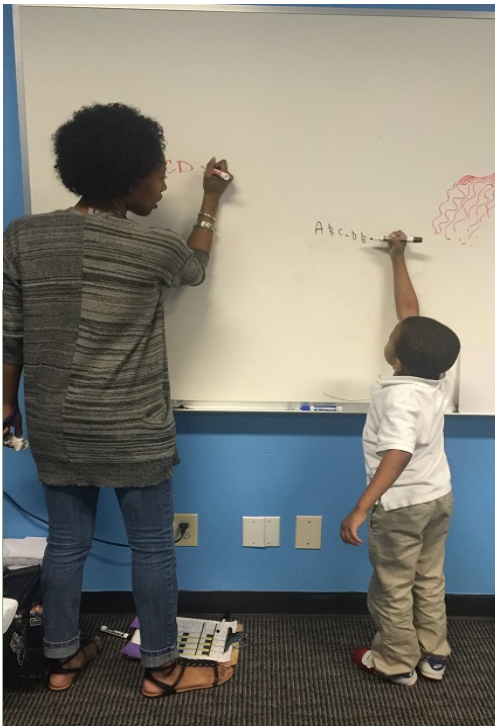

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About us

Executive Director, Nicole Hilmes, MS CCC-SLP, BCBA leads a staff of experienced professionals that work directly with your child and family.

The Autism Learning Center, LLC is dedicated to providing interventions based on the principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) to motivate children with Autism Spectrum Disorders or other developmental delays to independently communicate, play and socially engage in their community.

Your child's program will be implemented in his natural environment as well as during intense teaching trails at his desk. Our families also have the opportunity to receive parent training.

We offer therapy Monday - Friday for children ages 2-18.

Individuals attend therapy sessions a minimum of 2+ hours a week based upon their treatment plan.

We provide ABA center-based services and in-home ABA programs, standardized and criterion-referenced assessments, school consultations and trainings, functional behavior assessments, social skills groups, and research-based play skills.

Our facility includes a 3000 sq. foot play room, individual therapy rooms, a reading room, and a 7,000 sq. foot game room for older children.

The ALC works on activities of daily living skills which includes: preparing simple meals, washing clothes, making beds, brushing teeth, and toilet training.



What are the early signs of Autism?

- Any loss of speech or babbling or social skills at any age
- Does not play appropriately with toys or excessively lines toys or other objects up
- Is attached to one particular toy or object
- No big smiles or other warm, joyful expressions by six months or thereafter
- No back-and-forth sharing of signs, smiles, or other facial expressions by 9 months or thereafter.
- No babbling by 12 months
- No back-and-forth gestures, such as pointing, showing, reaching, or waving by 12 months.
- No words by 16 months
- At times seems to be hearing impaired
